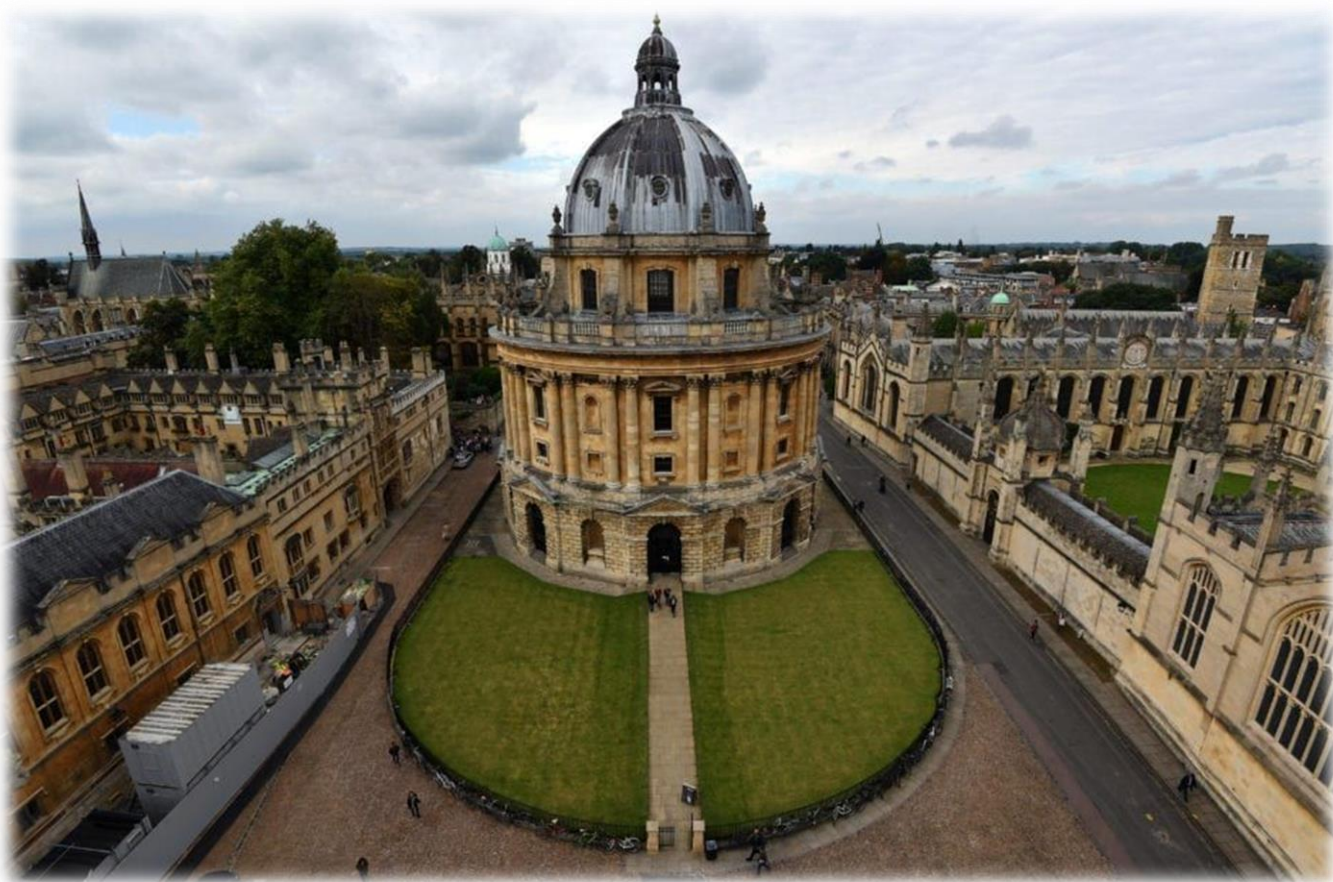

### **Please pay attention to**

Below, you will find the official rules but, generally, the crucial point is to respect each other and the ones we meet. We have a shared responsibility of making this a good trip for everyone:

- As always when gathered in ATY contexts, we meet up on time to avoid unnecessary waiting time
- You must always walk in pairs or groups

- If of legal drinking age, limited alcohol consumption is okay, but it must not in any way affect your academic engagement at any time
- Regarding the use of drugs, the same legislation applies in England as in Denmark

- We would like to know that everybody returns safely to the hostel in the evenings for which reason we make a list for you to tick as you return. We will have specific times for you to be back in the hostel every night.

Departure: Copenhagen Airport, Lufthavnsboulevarden 6, 2770 Kastrup

We meet at 14.30 in the departure section of Copenhagen Airport, Terminal 3 under the departure board

We will be flying British Airways departing at 16.55 (BA 809)

Arrival in Heathrow at 18.05

We go together in the underground to Safestay Holland Park from the airport. The fee for that is included.

### Thursday 17 October 2019

Departure Heathrow: We go together from Safestay Holland Park at 14.45 towards the underground.

We will be flying British Airways departing at 18.25 (BA 806)

Arrival in Billund at 21.10

Transportation to Copenhagen Airport and from Billund Airport is organised and paid by you.

### Transportation in London

Contactless visa cards can be used at all entrances/exits, and the price is the same as for the other cards.

It is possible to order oyster cards, visitor oyster cards and travelcards prior to leaving. You can also buy tickets on site.

### Hostel

Safestay Holland Park is placed in an centuries-old and protected castle in the middle of Holland Park located in the area Kensington. The building, which was built in 1605, was bombed during the Blitz in 1940, but have been reconstructed. The hostel is a short walk from Hyde Park and Notting Hill.

The has a large garden, and the Wi-Fi is free at the lounge and in the breakfast room.

The reception is open 24 hours/day. A continental breakfast buffet is served.

You will be staying in rooms of 15 beds with either private or shared bath and toilet. In the rooms you will find lockers. You need to bring your own towel, but linen is provided.

## Checklist

- Passport

## Luggage

You can bring:

- 1 suitcase (checked-in luggage) max. 23 kg (height (90)/width (75)/depth (43))
- 1 carry-on luggage max. 23 kg (H56xW45xD25)

You can bring *one* 1-litre re-closable bag for liquids in your carry-on luggage. In this bag, you can bring as many containers (100ml) as fits in it. Otherwise, you can bring liquids in your checked-in luggage.
